ANTIQUE WAGONS Peak around the side of the barn and up in the loft to view some antiques.

SOIL BANK It ain't pretty but this mound of dirt is some of the richest, most organically fertilized soil.

CHICKENS AND TURKEYS—It's not hard to spot a chicken or turkey on this farm, they freely roam all 13 acres.

Take a look behind you to see our solar panels on top of the barn roof.

Look closely in this pasture, you may find a calf or two. Also, say hello to our bull Ranger.

POND AND WOODS TRAIL Enjoy a jaunt around the pond and into "goat land". Be sure to close the gate behind you.


DUCKS GFFSF HFRONS and many other critters who make this pond their home can be spotted if you're lucky...and quiet.
